**Topic: Maine's New Probate Code** – This panel discussion, led by members of the Probate and Trust Law Advisory Commission, will discuss key provisions of Maine's new Probate Code, Title 18-C, scheduled to take effect on July 1, 2019. Topics to be discussed include changes to the Elective Share provisions and the Maine Uniform Guardianship, Conservatorship, & Protective Proceedings Act.

**David J. Backer, Esq.:** Attorney Backer is Drummond Woodsum's Practice Group Leader for Trust and Estate Planning. His practice is limited to trust and estate planning and administration. He is an elected Fellow of the American College of Trust and Estate Counsel (ACTEC). David also serves as Chair of Maine's Probate and Trust Law Advisory Commission ("PATLAC"), charged with conducting a continuing study of the probate and trust laws in Maine and making recommendations to the Legislature for improvements in Maine's probate and trust laws. PATLAC, created in 2010 by the Maine Legislature, is comprised of seven lawyers and three judges and David has served as a member and as Chair of PATLAC since its inception.
